Snickerdoodle Train Cake

1 1/4 c flour

1 c sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp salt

1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 c butter, melted

1/2 c sour cream

1 tsp vanilla

1/4 tsp almond extract



Bowl #1: combine flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt and cinnamon.

Bowl #2: combine melted butter, sour cream, eggs, vanilla, and almond extract. Mix until well blended.

Beat on medium speed for one minute. Pour into a greased and floured pan. I used the NordicWare Train Cake Pan.

Bake at 325 degrees for 20-27 minutes (I baked for 24 min). Cool.

Frost details with royal icing.

At our October meeting, Dennis Bartholow gave a fun and entertaining presentation on the history of railroading in the US and Scandinavia.



He discussed how

James J. Hill's Great Northern railroad promoted low cost land deals to entice immigrants from Scandinavia and Germany who settled along the route from Minnesota to Washington State. For example, in 1882 alone, 42,000 immigrants from northern Europe settled in the Red River Valley. Hill



also invested in founding schools and churches in these communities and they flourished along with the Great Northern railroad itself.

Dennis also talked model railroading as a hobby. From his own father building brass locomotives from scratch to Dennis' own successful business of updating other people's locomotives with modern digital control systems.






